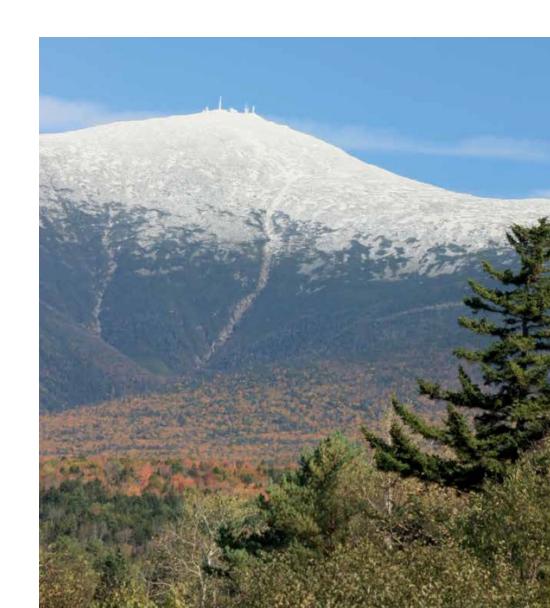
Broadband Equity, Access, & Deployment

BEAD

New Hampshire Department of Business and Economic Affairs (BEA) is the Administering Entity for the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD)

Program Grant.

This grant is provided by the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA), U.S. Department of Commerce.







• What does this mean for New Hampshire?

NH is allotted \$196.56M when approved by NTIA

The BEAD funding will be used to deploy or upgrade broadband networks to ensure that everyone has access to reliable, affordable, high-speed Internet service.

Once deployment goals are met, any remaining funding can be used to pursue eligible access-, adoption-, and equity-related uses.

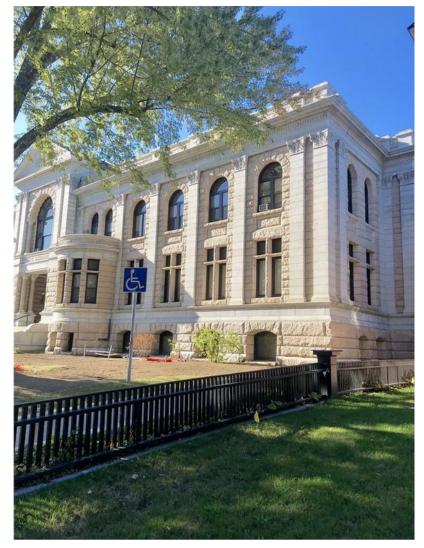
About the Project

- Affordable broadband
- Free donor-funded refurbished and new <u>laptops</u> bundled with drive image pointing to systemic inclusion resources
- <u>Multilingual tech support</u> provided by New Americans & other English Learners, for learners of all ages (Pre-K/parents through seniors)
- <u>Digital, media, information & financial literacy and cybersafety skill</u> development and skills to use AI safely, effectively and ethically
- Sustained conversation among educators at all levels fostering digital access, digital skill and digital pedagogy for all NH learners and their educators
- More inclusive, accessible info referral for essential inclusion supports
- <u>Professional development</u> and <u>curriculum development</u> funds to WFD leaders and their partners

- Require every learner enrolled for ACP broadband subsidy, have a laptop

- Strengthen skills of all educators to provide competency-based learning facilitation and performance assessments
- Develop/strengthen e-portfolio tools for competency-based industry recognized credentias
